# Freedom of Information Act Request Response No. 13022016-1

## Question

Dear Northamptonshire Police and Crime Commissioner, Section 10 of the theft states:

### THEFT ACT 1968 SEC 10(1).

A person is guilty of aggravated burglary if he commits any burglary and at the time he has with him any firearm or imitation firearm, any weapon of offence, or any explosive.

However as of April 2015 their is a document by the the home office titled "Home off counting rules for recorded crime" which states:

Example 5: A person enters a house as a trespasser armed with a knife and confronts the male and female occupiers. They are both threatened with violence and as a result hand over their watches before the suspect leaves.

Two crimes of robbery (class 34B).

The document states "with effect from April 2015"

Am I right in believing:

(1) As of April 2015 the home office has added counting rules that can consider part of an aggravated burglary described above at example 5 as robbery under class 34b

and:

(2) Before the Home Office counting rules came into effect on April 2015, the offence described by the Home Office above at example 5 would be aggravated burglary

### Answer

I am writing to advise you that, following a search of our paper and electronic records, I have established that the information you requested is not held by this Department.
